The M.e.t.'s biannual [Fairgrounds Pollutant Collection](#) event at the Tulsa State Fairgrounds is the only free opportunity in Tulsa to dispose of your household hazardous waste properly. It is a truly important event that creates a safer and cleaner neighborhood and community. The collection is for residents of Bixby, Broken Arrow, Claremore, Collinsville, Coweta, Glenpool, Jenks, Owasso, Sand Springs, Tulsa and Tulsa County only, not businesses.

**Items accepted include:** household cleaners, pesticides, fertilizers, automotive fluids, cooking oil, batteries, all fluorescent light bulbs, small ammunition, smoke alarms, aerosol paint, hobby paint, pool chemicals, items containing mercury, gasoline, and unused or out-of-date prescription medications.

**Items NOT accepted at the event:** latex paint, tires, computers, radioactive waste and commercial waste. Latex paint is not accepted because it is not hazardous. It is water-based and can safely be disposed of by being dried out. Remove the lid and let the paint completely dry. Tulsa residents can place 2 cans of dry paint next to regular residential trash for pick up.

**Batteries? Oil? Don't wait!**

While you can take batteries, oil, and antifreeze to the Fairgrounds Pollutant Collection, there's no need to wait in line if this is all you have. These products, along with recyclables such as

paper, plastic, glass and aluminum, can be taken seven days a week to one of our [Recycling Centers](#).
