Subject: Supplier change for Lenovo US Consumer Recycling Program


To Whom It May Concern:

Beginning September 8, 2010, Lenovo's US Consumer Recycling Program will be operated by AERCCR, Inc. The transition to the new supplier will be seamless for consumers and they will link automatically to Lenovo's new interface from the current US Consumer Recycling Program webpage at www.lenovo.com/lenovo/environment/usconsumerrecycling.

Lenovo is committed to leadership in environmental affairs in all of its business activities. Lenovo follows applicable regulations around the world and is committed to doing more. In the US, Lenovo offers a free recycling program for households and home based businesses covering all Lenovo manufactured products nationwide. Lenovo believes these programs meet the requirements of Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Act. The program is publicized on Lenovo's recycling webpage at www.lenovo.com/lenovo/environment/usconsumerrecycling. Details of this program are included below.

Recycling Plan Details:

Consumers in Oklahoma are able to return their used Lenovo manufactured covered devices for recycling through the program website at www.lenovo.com/lenovo/environment/usconsumerrecycling free of charge. The program covers Lenovo manufactured desktop and notebook computers and computer monitors. Lenovo has partnered with AERCCR and AERCCR's Take-Back and Regulatory Compliance management system to offer this program.

Consumers in Oklahoma can access the website and enter information about their location and equipment. Based on this information, a shipping label is generated, which the consumer can

utilize to ship their used Lenovo product for recycling free of charge. Consumers merely pack the product and ship it using the free shipping label.

Section 5 C. The recovery plan shall fully explain how the manufacturer will collect from a consumer and recover each covered devices that is labeled with the manufacturer's brand, at no charge to the consumer. The manufacturer's recovery plan under this subsection may use existing collection and consolidation infrastructure for handling covered devices and may include electronic recycling and repair shops, recyclers of other commodities, reuse organizations, nonprofit corporations, retailers, recyclers, or other suitable operations.

The Lenovo program, as described above, provides free recycling for all Lenovo branded covered devices. The program provides free shipping to the consumer and free recycling. The details of the program are explained above.

Section 5 D. The recovery plan shall provide for covered device collection services that are reasonably convenient and available, and designed to meet the collection needs of consumers in this state. Nonexclusive examples of collection methods that alone or in combination meet the convenience requirements of this section include:

1. A mail-back system, at no cost to the consumer, whereby the consumer can return a covered device through the mail, including, but not limited to, a system in which the consumer can go online, print a prepaid shipping label, package the product, and schedule an at home pickup for shipment back to the manufacturer.

Lenovo's recycling offering is a mail-back system with prepaid shipping labels for Oklahoma consumers.

Section 5E. If a manufacture does not offer a mail-back system, it shall submit for approval...

Not applicable, Lenovo is offering a mail-back system.

Section 5F. The recovery plan shall also include a statement that the manufacturer will not dispose of covered devices in landfills or transfer covered devices to computer equipment recycling facilities that dispose of covered devices in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts.

Covered devices recovered through Lenovo's US consumer recycling program are not disposed of in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts.

Section 5G. Each manufacturer operating or publishing a web site for providing product information about a covered device shall include information about collection and recovery for consumers and provide such information to the Department. The manufacturer shall also include such information in the packaging or accompanying the sale of the covered device.
