**Re: Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Plan for Fuhu, Inc.**

Dear Ms. Adler-McKibben:

Fuhu, Inc. ("Fuhu") is pleased to submit its Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Plan. This plan follows the Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Plan Guide as provided on the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality website.

1. *The manufacturer must adopt and implemented a recovery plan, either alone or in cooperation with other manufacturers.*

Fuhu currently operates an equipment recovery program that meets the requirements of the Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Act.

2. *The recovery plan must fully explain how the manufacturer will collect from a consumer and recover each covered device that is labeled with the manufacturer's brand, at no charge to the consumer.*

Fuhu offers a mail-back recycling program that meets the requirements of the Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Act. The program is offered on the product website, at [www.nabitablet.com/recycle](http://www.nabitablet.com/recycle) and gives consumers information on how to send in their old NABI tablets for recycling, free of charge. Fuhu then arranges for the recycling of those products through its recycler who is compliant with all e-waste recycler requirements.

3. *The recovery plan must provide for covered device collection services that are reasonably convenient and available.*

The mail-back program is available online and available to all consumers of Fuhu tablet products, free of charge to the consumer.

4. *The recovery plan must be designed to meet the collection needs of consumers in this state.*

Oklahoma consumers can access the website online, and are able to mail back products for recycling, free of charge. This is designed to meet the needs of consumers with old NABI tablets.

5. *If the manufacturer does not offer a mail-back system, it must submitted for approval by the Department of Environmental Quality a plan that offers reasonably convenient collections.*

Not applicable. Fuhu offers a free and convenient mail-back system.

6. *The recovery plan must include a statement that the manufacturer will not dispose of covered devices in landfills or transfer covered devices to computer equipment recycling facilities that dispose of covered devices in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts.*

Covered devices recovered through Fuhu's Computer Equipment Recovery Program in Oklahoma are not disposed of in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts.

7. *If a manufacturer operates or publishes a web site for providing product information about a covered device they must include information about collection and recovery for consumers on their web site. Also must include a link to it in the recovery plan.*
