Subject: Computer Equipment Recovery Plan for Visual Land, Inc.

Mr. Thompson,

Visual Land, Inc is pleased to submit our Oklahoma Computer our Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Plan. This plan follows the outline given on your website at <http://www.deq.state.ok.us/lpdnew/EWaste/Recovery%20Plan%20Guide.pdf>.

1. The manufacturer must adopt an implement a recovery plan, either alone or in cooperation with other manufacturers.

Visual Land currently operates a take-back and recycling mail-back program for Visual Land branded tablets. This will serve as our recovery plan for Oklahoma consumers. This recovery plan applies to all Visual Land branded products. There are no Visual Land products that are sold that do not have the Visual Land name affixed to them, nor are there any Visual Land products sold under another name. Visual Land "covered devices" as defined in Oklahoma law include our Tablets.

2. The recovery plan must fully explain how the manufacturer will collect from a consumer and recover each covered device that is labeled with the manufacturer's brand, at no charge to the consumer.

Visual Land, Inc. offers a take-back program that meets the requirements of the Oklahoma Computer Equipment Recovery Act. It is offered on the Visual Land Website and it is a web-based mail back offering that is free to the consumer, including shipping. A consumer wishing to recycle a Visual Land Tablet can go online and enter their product information in the web-based tool. A postage paid mailing label will then be sent to the consumer so they can package and mail back their product. www.visual-land.com/recycle.html

3. The recovery plan must provide for covered device collection services that are reasonably convenient and available.

Since USPS is widely available throughout Oklahoma, we believe this is the best collection mail back method.

4. The recovery plan must be designed to meet the collection needs of consumers in this state.

Because Oklahoma residents can go online and arrange for free shipping, this recovery plan will meet the needs of the consumers with old Visual Land products.

5. The manufacturer does not offer a mail-back system, it must submit for approval by the Department of Environmental Quality plan that offers reasonably convenient collections.

Not applicable- Visual Land does offer a mail-back system.

6. The recovery plan must include a statement that the manufacturer will not dispose of covered devices in landfills or transfer covered devices to computer equipment recycling facilities that dispose of covered devices in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts.



7. If the manufacturer operates or publishes a web site for providing product information about a covered device they must include information about collection and recovery for consumers on their web site. Also must include a link to it in the recovery plan.
