



## Bethany Public Water Supply

The Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), the Oklahoma City Airport Trust, and the City of Bethany are investigating the possible extent of an area of shallow contaminated ground water. As part of this investigation, ground water testing and drilling will be conducted in the street, along NW 46th Street in Bethany, Oklahoma (see map). Drilling will create minimal noise and should not impact your regular activities. The entire area of the ground water contamination has not been fully determined, but it appears to be moving to the west under the southern portion of the Wiley Post Airport (former Aero Commander facility).

The levels of contamination in the ground water are relatively low, but some areas may exceed drinking water levels established in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Safe Drinking Water Act. The Bethany Public Water Supply has been tested and there has been no detection of contamination in the drinking water.
