
HTC America, Inc. ("HTC") has adopted and implemented the recovery plan described herein, as required by the Oklahoma Computer Equipment and Recovery Act ("Act") at Title 27A, Section 2-11-605 of the Oklahoma Statutes. HTC is a manufacturer of covered devices under the Act. We maintain a mail-back recovery plan as a means for Oklahoma consumers to properly and safely dispose of their old or unwanted electronic devices at no cost.

The HTC recycling program is reasonably convenient and available to Oklahoma consumers. Consumers can download a free shipping label online and return their obsolete electronic equipment to HTC for responsible recycling. HTC accepts, at no charge, covered devices that are labeled with the HTC brand as well as any other mobile phone, smartphone, or tablet computer, regardless of its condition or manufacturer. HTC publishes information and instructions about its mail-back recovery plan at the HTC recycling program website, www.freeurecycle.com.

HTC does not dispose of covered devices in landfills or transfer covered devices to recycling facilities that dispose of covered devices in landfills other than necessary incidental disposal in de minimis amounts. When consumers mail in old electronic equipment, HTC's ISO 14001-certified partner, The Wireless Source, either refurbishes the devices for reuse or recycles them in a manner consistent with ISRI's Electronic Recycling Operating Practices and EPA's Responsible Recycling Practices.
