2 Does anybody have any changes to
3 those Minutes? Fabulous.
4 Could I have a motion to approve the
5 Minutes, please?
6 MR. NISWANDER: Make a motion we
7 approve as written.
8 MS. ELDER: Thank you. And --
9 MAJOR GANN: I'll second.
10 MS. ELDER: Thank you. All in
11 favor, aye.
12 ALL MEMBERS: Aye.
13 (Unanimously).
14 MS. ELDER: Opposed, same sign?
15 MEMBERS: (No verbal response).
16 MS. ELDER: Okay. We've approved
17 the Minutes.
18 Well, Bonnie is not here for the
19 Oklahoma Emergency Management Update. I'll
20 send her an email. I'll tell you what I
21 think is happening. They are moving their
22 offices. You know, they have been -- well,
23 they've been divided anyway. They'll still
24 be divided, Oklahoma Emergency Management,
25 but here have been several people that have

2 MS. ELDER: I would like to call
3 to order the third quarterly meeting if
4 you're looking at fiscal years. If you're
5 looking at calendar years, it's the first
6 quarterly meeting of the OHMERC, on
7 February 19th, 2013 at 1:30.
8 And Quiana, could you call the roll
9 for me, please.
10 MS. FIELDS: Gary Davis is
11 absent. Chief Robert Doke is absent.
12 Michael Galloway.
13 MR. GALLOWAY: Here.
14 MS. FIELDS: Major Dennis Gann.
15 MAJOR GANN: Here.
16 MS. FIELDS: Bonnie McKelvey is
17 absent.
18 Steven Niswander.
19 MR. NISWANDER: Here.
20 MS. FIELDS: Monty Elder.
21 MS. ELDER: Here.
22 So we do have a quorum. So our
23 order of -- practically the only order of
24 business is the approval of the November
25 27, 2012 Minutes. I think people have had

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1 been over at the Santa Fe location. I
2 don't know if you all are familiar with it.
3 They're moving somewhere close to the
4 Capitol. It's over by the transportation
5 building. So that office is moving over by
6 the transportation building --
7 MR. GALLOWAY: I think it's the
8 AG's building, I think.
9 MS. ELDER: Right.
10 MR. GALLOWAY: The new Attorney
11 General's building.
12 MS. ELDER: Yeah. I think so.
13 Somewhere they're moving and I believe that
14 they're moving like now. So that's
15 probably why she's not here. So anyway,
16 we'll have to get her to send us her new
17 address and hopefully the phone numbers
18 will stay the same.
19 I can tell you that Bonnie and I
20 have been to a couple of LEPC meetings.
21 LEPCs that are trying to get started up.
22 She's still working on getting LEPCs to
23 apply for the HMEP grant, the planning side
24 of the grant. As you know, the last couple
25 of years we've had more requirements on

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1 that grant and as a result we've had -- we
2 actually, last year, had to give some money
3 back. We just don't want to do that. Give
4 any money back so we're working on --
5 MR. NISWANDER: Let me know when
6 you have that problem.
7 MS. ELDER: Contact Bonnie. But
8 we have this -- I know, for example, that
9 Pawnee is going to do a hazardous
10 transportation study, studying roots of
11 emergency -- extremely hazardous substances
12 in -- you know, through the town and so we
13 do have some good projects going on. And,
14 Mike, have you -- do you want to give us --
15 off the top of your head, an update on your
16 projects? I assume you have some.
17 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, basically
18 I'm going to do the same thing again. This
19 one was done in Clinton --
20 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
21 MR. GALLOWAY: -- where I used
22 these funds to pay OSU -- well, it's one of
23 the classes Homeland Security doesn't pay
24 for.
25 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.

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1 MR. GALLOWAY: So it is a propane
2 class --
3 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
4 MR. GALLOWAY: -- and they came
5 to Clinton and did it for what I call my
6 west side of the county.
7 MS. ELDER: Yeah.
8 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, this year
9 I'm going to do it in Weatherford and catch
10 the fire departments on the east side which
11 includes the counties that touch them.
12 MS. ELDER: Sure.
13 MR. GALLOWAY: So there's some
14 fire departments from Caddo, Blaine, and
15 Custer that will participate in similar
16 training.
17 MS. ELDER: Good. And --
18 MR. GALLOWAY: It's about
19 \$5,000.00 when pay for OSU and the propane.
20 MS. ELDER: Right. And, you
21 know, I think that's an excellent use of
22 that money because, one, every single
23 community has propane in it in Oklahoma.
24 Everybody's got propane and that's one of
25 the classes that we don't already pay for

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1 with the grant, training grant that we give
2 to OSU. Obviously you can't duplicate.
3 Some people have asked for training money
4 that duplicates OSU. I'm also on the
5 Citizen Corp Council for the State and the
6 Citizen Corp grants, sometimes people want
7 to do training that's duplicated, you know,
8 OSU that's free, and we can't let people do
9 that. But the training like the propane is
10 really valuable and not duplicated, we
11 certainly want to encourage that.
12 MR. NISWANDER: Mike, when is
13 your deal going to be in Clinton?
14 MR. GALLOWAY: This was past, so
15 we already did the Clinton one. The
16 Weatherford one --
17 MR. NISWANDER: The Weatherford,
18 I'm sorry.
19 MR. GALLOWAY: -- we're waiting
20 for OSU to pick a date. But it will be
21 April, May. Not far away.
22 MS. ELDER: It -- would you --
23 MR. GALLOWAY: I haven't done the
24 application yet.
25 MS. ELDER: You better.

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1 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, I have the
2 money to pay for it and then I'll ask you
3 guys to pay me back for that program.
4 MR. NISWANDER: Would it be
5 beneficial to fit into your program to have
6 a propane transport cargo tank there that
7 you could walk in and see how they're made?
8 How they load and unload?
9 MR. GALLOWAY: Yes. We did that
10 when -- with the railroad when --
11 MR. NISWANDER: You had a rail
12 car?
13 MR. GALLOWAY: -- John Hall --
14 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
15 MR. GALLOWAY: -- did Transcare.
16 Transcare did it --
17 MR. NISWANDER: Okay.
18 MR. GALLOWAY: -- and so we did
19 it --
20 MR. NISWANDER: You did it in
21 Burleson?
22 MR. GALLOWAY: -- yeah, we did it
23 here in Oklahoma City and Tulsa.
24 MR. NISWANDER: It's going to be
25 here in March, Transcare is.

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1 MR. GALLOWAY: And so I'm -- I
2 helped John Hall so I'm familiar with
3 Transcare's program.
4 MR. NISWANDER: We're going to
5 have two trailers of Transcare. One of
6 them is at 3/31, the other one is at 4/06.
7 MR. GALLOWAY: But you're
8 offering the 18-wheeler trailer; right?
9 MR. NISWANDER: Yes.
10 MR. GALLOWAY: Not the railroad
11 trailer type-thing.
12 MR. NISWANDER: The 18-wheeler
13 trailer that has two doors that fold out
14 and walk up to see how the lines are
15 inside.
16 MR. GALLOWAY: The answer is yes,
17 if you're offering it. So Mike Carlin
18 (phonetic) is who's -- we're going to do it
19 at Weatherford Fire Station, I believe, or
20 at the technology center there. They have
21 a fire training center at Weatherford.
22 MS. ELDER: When you get that
23 finalized, why don't you send me or Jami
24 the date and the things and we'll send that
25 out to everybody in the OHMERC.

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1 MR. NISWANDER: Because we will
2 have something at Transcare. I've been
3 working with them. We will have two
4 trailers down there, I think, it's March
5 25th, 26th, something like that.
6 MS. ELDER: Right.
7 MR. GALLOWAY: I left my phone in
8 the pickup so I don't have my calendar.
9 MS. ELDER: John Paul sent me a
10 thing asking me how we get CEUs for that
11 course and I forwarded it to Gary and I
12 haven't heard back from Gary, because DEQ
13 doesn't do CE -- you know, continuing
14 education, but I thought maybe Gary would
15 know. Would you know, Dennis?
16 MAJOR GANN: (Inaudible).
17 MR. NISWANDER: I think it's
18 March 19th, 20th, 21st, something like
19 that.
20 MS. ELDER: Well --
21 MR. GALLOWAY: Are you talking
22 about the CEU part?
23 MS. ELDER: (Inaudible).
24 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, what we did
25 there with the railroad is they brought in

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1 an OSU fire training instructor. I mean he
2 did a presentation.
3 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
4 MR. GALLOWAY: It was tough
5 because it was windy but he had his little
6 flip chart and he was training -- most of
7 the people he was talking to were fire
8 fighters. But there was OHP there and ODOT
9 there. This was at the -- it was right
10 here by Tinker. I don't remember --
11 MAJOR GANN: What we do is --
12 MR. GALLOWAY: -- the roads in
13 northern yard.
14 MS. ELDER: Yeah.
15 MAJOR GANN: -- we would just
16 submit the curriculum to CLEET and they
17 would either approve it or not approve it.
18 MS. ELDER: Okay. Okay.
19 MR. GALLOWAY: For CEUs?
20 MAJOR GANN: Yeah.
21 MR. GALLOWAY: So CLEET on law
22 enforcement side --
23 MS. ELDER: Well, how about for a
24 fire department?
25 MR. GALLOWAY: OSU would be your

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1 contact for that.
2 MS. ELDER: Yeah. Okay. Well,
3 I'll just email John and give him that
4 information because I knew -- I thought
5 Gary would know but like I said Gary must
6 be busy, because he hasn't emailed me back
7 on that.
8 MS. MURPHY: I have a question
9 about HMEP grants --
10 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
11 MS. MURPHY: -- that I wish you
12 would ask Bonnie about or maybe you can
13 answer.
14 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
15 MS. MURPHY: And I'm -- you know,
16 we all know this was kind of a difficult
17 cycle for a lot of the LEPCs.
18 Since these are operating on a
19 reimbursement basis, how do they have to
20 encumber that money by a fixed date? That
21 throws me.
22 MS. ELDER: Well, we just have to
23 make sure that those contracts are done if
24 they're going to have a contract with
25 somebody.

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1 MS. MURPHY: Right. But if they
2 don't have a contract and -- if the work is
3 being done by the LEPC members -- do you
4 see where I'm going with this, Monty?
5 MS. ELDER: Well, you have -- are
6 you paying the LEPC members?
7 MS. MURPHY: No. We're looking
8 at the volunteer rate.
9 MS. ELDER: Well, what then are
10 you paying for?
11 MS. MURPHY: Materials. But that
12 comes in later.
13 MS. ELDER: Well, I think you
14 have to have it order or something. I
15 don't know. You will have to talk to
16 Bonnie about that.
17 MS. MURPHY: Okay. That's kind
18 of what I was --
19 MS. ELDER: Yeah. I think that
20 --
21 MS. MURPHY: -- pitching that out
22 there for was --
23 MS. ELDER: Yeah.
24 MS. MURPHY: -- they're not sure
25 what that means and since they're not

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1 handing money to the LEPCs directly,
2 everything works on a reimbursement basis.
3 MS. ELDER: Right. Right. And
4 we're -- have tried to get from DOT if
5 people can submit to us what things cost,
6 like the invoice --
7 MR. NISWANDER: Or a PO, at
8 least.
9 MS. ELDER: -- a PO, and then
10 reimbursed on the PO so that they wouldn't
11 have to do it upfront. But we haven't
12 gotten an answer back for DOT on that from
13 PHMSA.
14 And I believe -- there's a new
15 Secretary of Transportation or head of --
16 and also of PHMSA; is that right?
17 MR. NISWANDER: The Secretary of
18 Transportation is stepping down --
19 MR. GALLOWAY: Yeah, they haven't
20 --
21 MR. NISWANDER: -- he is not
22 going to leave until --
23 MS. ELDER: Until they have
24 another one?
25 MR. NISWANDER: -- they have

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1 another one.
2 MS. ELDER: Right. Okay. And
3 so, hopefully, if I get any more
4 information from Bonnie I'll pass that
5 along.
6 And then Jami is going to handle the
7 Data Management Report because Tom Bergman
8 is out trying to help people do Tier 2.
9 MR. NISWANDER: He better be in
10 Oklahoma City Thursday. He's supposed to
11 do a meeting for me.
12 MS. ELDER: He is. It's on the
13 schedule.
14 MR. NISWANDER: Okay.
15 MS. ELDER: It's on the schedule.
16 MR. NISWANDER: He better be
17 there.
18 He's not traveling too far, is that
19 what you're saying?
20 MS. ELDER: He's not -- it's on
21 the schedule.
22 MS. MURPHY: Well, the Tier 2
23 filing deadline is March 1st as we all know
24 and that is keeping Tom incredibly busy.
25 And if you will look at the first article

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1 of -- first item rather, under the Data
2 Management Report, you'll see that there
3 have been quite a number of phone calls and
4 emails that are Tier 2 related and that's
5 only about a third of the anticipated
6 reports for 2012. It says for 2013; it's
7 actually for 2012 received.
8 Second item are CAMEO classes that
9 Tom has done since the last SERT meeting.
10 One with OHP, and one with OKLAHOMA CITY
11 Hazmat.
12 Item three lists the Tier 2
13 assistant workshop -- assistance workshops,
14 excuse me, that's Tom has done. You can
15 see he's doing a really good job of getting
16 around the state. Excuse me.
17 It's the fourth item I really would
18 like for you to take a look at and that is
19 that there are changes coming to MARPLOT
20 and this is a hundred percent Tom thing. I
21 don't know what form those changes will
22 take but we do know that, for sure, we're
23 going to have to have a new CAMEO suite to
24 do the modeling that we've done in the past
25 and MARPLOT is so integral to that. I

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1 haven't heard Tom mention a time frame for
2 when that new MARPLOT will come out but I
3 am sure that he will let us know as soon as
4 he knows.
5 And the last item is TRI, that's me.
6 And EPA released their national data
7 analysis. We had a press release prepared
8 as well. Our data analysis is complete
9 on the 2013 data which is -- excuse me, the
10 2011 data which is the most recent database
11 that we have. The 2012 reports aren't even
12 due until July 1st of this year. If you
13 would like to see any of that data
14 analyses, if you would like to see any of
15 the charts or tables, please contact me.
16 MS. ELDER: And I would like to
17 mention that this year, rather than mailing
18 out thousands of letters for Tier 2
19 reminders, we emailed because when you
20 submit online you have to give us an email
21 so we had emails for folks. So we emailed
22 out reminders for Tier 2.
23 What I think is happening, because
24 we are a little bit behind where we
25 normally are at this time period, I think

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1 some people still are expecting to get a
2 letter from us. I think the changeover to
3 email, while efficient, may be some people
4 didn't pay attention it or it went to their
5 spam filter, whatever. So after March 1st,
6 Jimmy Carter in my office and Tom are going
7 to be really busy going -- reconciling last
8 year's reports and this year's and then
9 they'll make phone calls to everybody who
10 did not file. We do that anyway but I
11 think there will be more reconciliation
12 than normal and I think it's just this
13 changeover -- just people getting used to
14 getting emails rather than a letter.
15 MR. NISWANDER: You sent it to
16 the emails of the person then issued it, is
17 that what you did?
18 MS. ELDER: We send it to the
19 email to the person who submitted.
20 MR. NISWANDER: Yeah. May I
21 suggest that when you do that you also ask
22 if that company has a website because the
23 person that submitted that may not be there
24 anymore.
25 MS. ELDER: Right.

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1 MR. GALLOWAY: And that thing is
2 -- some the IT departments, they wait 90
3 days and they cut them off.
4 MS. ELDER: Right.
5 MR. GALLOWAY: So they clear out
6 --
7 MS. ELDER: Right.
8 MR. GALLOWAY: -- person
9 (inaudible).
10 MS. ELDER: Right. And, you
11 know, sometimes that happens with addresses
12 too.
13 MR. NISWANDER: Yeah.
14 MS. ELDER: It's --
15 MR. GALLOWAY: Physical address,
16 the snail mail.
17 MS. ELDER: Physical addresses.
18 It's hard to do that.
19 MR. GALLOWAY: What I'm asking to
20 do is to solve both problems, is ask the
21 person who submits to put -- to create an
22 email that's done by title.
23 MR. NISWANDER: Yeah.
24 MR. GALLOWAY: So that that email
25 from the regulatory person goes to that

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1 position even though the person goes away
2 so that Notice still -- that box stays
3 current or stays open and all you do is
4 change the password when you change the
5 person. We're asking cities and a lot of
6 cities are starting to do that. They put
7 CityManager@Clinton.org so that City
8 Manager mail keeps coming even though one
9 may be gone or they're in transition.
10 I've had the same problem at the
11 local level LEPC --
12 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
13 MR. GALLOWAY: -- where I send
14 out -- I literally send out 400 invites and
15 I get 30 people to come to the meeting.
16 But a lot of those invites are just FYI,
17 for your information --
18 MS. ELDER: Right.
19 MR. GALLOWAY: -- and so -- but I
20 have the same problem that he spoke of, the
21 person I sent it to three months ago isn't
22 the person that's in charge of coming to
23 the meeting anymore. And so --
24 MS. ELDER: Right.
25 MR. GALLOWAY: -- snail mail

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1 doesn't help. I've done it by snail mail
2 and I actually get the letter back saying
3 this person no longer works there. You
4 would have thought they gave it to the
5 right person, you know, when you send it to
6 their office.

7 MS. ELDER: Yeah.

8 MR. NISWANDER: We've had our
9 best luck asking for the website at the
10 address for that company. So --

11 MS. ELDER: So -- well, you know,
12 we'll -- we use that Tier 2 software which
13 already has things built into it, but
14 that's a good idea and I'll pass it on to
15 Tom and see if, you know, he might make
16 some changes in the future to that.

17 And I know that the MARPLOT program
18 is going -- is completely different. So
19 that means that everybody who is using it
20 in Oklahoma, there's going to have to be a
21 big push for reeducation of it.

22 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, that's
23 happening anyway and I've put so much stuff
24 on this old laptop --

25 MS. ELDER: Yeah.

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1 MR. GALLOWAY: -- the laptop
2 died. So --

3 MS. ELDER: Yeah.

4 MR. GALLOWAY: -- you know, if
5 you're not careful you've got to rebuild
6 all that stuff anyway. So just like the
7 software and the hardware --

8 MS. ELDER: Yeah.

9 MR. GALLOWAY: -- I figured it
10 was coming.

11 MS. ELDER: Yeah. And --

12 MR. GALLOWAY: And everybody
13 likes Google Earth and I think they're
14 leaning towards something --

15 MS. ELDER: Yeah. I think it's
16 something -- I believe it's like Google
17 Earth. That's what I think it is.

18 MR. NISWANDER: Is that Chrome?

19 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, Chrome is
20 just Google's new operating system for the
21 website. It is awesome, but the Google
22 Earth is the software that allows you to do
23 the mapping. And the MARPLOT is going to
24 be similar --

25 MS. ELDER: Similar to Google

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1 Earth, I believe.

2 MR. GALLOWAY: And I --

3 MS. ELDER: And as it is now you
4 can -- if you've got Google Earth on your
5 computer you can put Tier 2 information
6 directly into Google Earth like a
7 spreadsheet and it will map it, which is a
8 pretty nifty deal. It's a nifty deal.

9 MR. GALLOWAY: I've used the
10 Water Resource Board's KML files --

11 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.

12 MR. GALLOWAY: -- which is Google
13 Earth and also DEQ's.

14 MS. ELDER: Right.

15 MR. GALLOWAY: And they are
16 nifty.

17 MS. ELDER: Yeah.

18 MR. GALLOWAY: If that's a
19 technical term.

20 MS. ELDER: It is. It is a very
21 technical term. I don't know that I have
22 any discussion on emergency responses. I
23 did want to mention a couple of things
24 probably people notice already. DOT has
25 put out an apt for your phone for ERG. If

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1 you've got an I-phone, an Android phone, or
2 a Blackberry there is an apt you can do to
3 put on your phone.

4 MR. GALLOWAY: That's coming from
5 PHMSA.

6 MS. ELDER: PHMSA, right. Yeah.

7 Okay. There's an apt that is on my phone
8 so just -- I think everybody probably
9 probably knows it but to give people a
10 heads-up you can go to that website to get
11 that or just look up ERG in your apt store
12 and it's free. So that's that.

13 Also Senator Longberg (phonetic),
14 who actually I think is going to retire,
15 but you know is one of the senior Senators
16 and person who, years ago, introduced the
17 SARA Title 3 with legislation, has
18 introduced a bill in the Senate to do with
19 the chemical facility anti-terrorism
20 standards for water and wastewater
21 facilities. They have -- water and
22 wastewater facilities have been exempt in
23 the past. There have been several reports
24 out, obviously, about chlorine at water and
25 wastewater facilities and so there is

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1 legislation out there to put standards for
2 security and safety and working with
3 emergency responders in the community on
4 that. So I haven't seen that legislation,
5 but it is out there so --
6 MR. GALLOWAY: I didn't know they
7 were exempt. Mine work with --
8 MS. ELDER: They work with EPA
9 but they work with the DHS.
10 MR. GALLOWAY: DHS?
11 MS. ELDER: Department of
12 Homeland Security.
13 MR. GALLOWAY: Oh.
14 MS. ELDER: They don't -- they're
15 exempt from the Department of Homeland
16 Security program, which has mixed reviews
17 on its effectiveness. I mean, it does. I
18 mean -- people turned in --
19 MR. GALLOWAY: Well, I did some
20 of those pretty effective.
21 MR. NISWANDER: No comment. It's
22 being recorded.
23 MR. GALLOWAY: I -- I invited my
24 local FBI agent, and myself, the LEPC, and
25 we toured the water sites. That did more

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1 than any federal program ever did.
2 MS. ELDER: Right. That's a --
3 MR. GALLOWAY: They just -- why
4 is the FBI here for? Well, he wanted to
5 come.
6 Why did he want to come?
7 Well, he wanted to see how easy it
8 was to blow up your chlorine tank.
9 Really. Well, what would it take to
10 protect it?
11 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
12 MR. GALLOWAY: And then we
13 started talking about (inaudible) security
14 and it's taken several years but we
15 actually did (inaudible) of security,
16 motion detectors are expensive.
17 MS. ELDER: Right.
18 MR. GALLOWAY: But they did it
19 voluntarily --
20 MS. ELDER: Uh-huh.
21 MR. GALLOWAY: -- which was even
22 better than having somebody to tell you to
23 do it.
24 MS. ELDER: It's interesting the
25 -- the bill as introduced and, again I

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1 don't know if it will go anywhere, has
2 advocates and has both look at apparently
3 safer technologies which may be not using
4 chlorine gas but using chloramines. In
5 Oklahoma, and again I don't know the status
6 of it, but there is a bill introduced to
7 say that water plants can't use chloramine.
8 So I can see that there might be -- if both
9 bills pass there might be some conflict
10 between the two of them.
11 MR. GALLOWAY: Can't use chlorine
12 or chloramine?
13 MS. ELDER: Chloramine. Can't
14 use chloramine.
15 MR. GALLOWAY: Okay.
16 MS. ELDER: At the state
17 Legislature there is a bill introduced for
18 that.
19 MR. GALLOWAY: Okay.
20 MS. ELDER: So I can see that
21 there might be some conflicts and I don't
22 know if either bill would pass, but if both
23 bills pass you would get one of those
24 conflicts you have between federal and
25 state laws which might be interesting. so

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1 that's all I know.
2 The National Association of Sara
3 Title 3 Program officials, the NASTTPO
4 meeting is being held the third week in
5 April, so it's like the 14th -- that week
6 that the 14th is in there, in Vail,
7 Colorado. And if people would like more
8 information about that you can go to
9 www.nasttpo.com, n-a-s-t-t-p-o.com.
10 (Comments)
11 MS. ELDER: So does anybody else
12 have anything?
13 MR. GALLOWAY: No.
14 MS. ELDER: Okay. This may be a
15 record. The next -- oh, I know. The next
