Instructions for Completing Designated Management Agency (DMA) Forms

Designated Management Agencies (DMA) are required under Sections 201 and 208 of the <u>Clean Water Act (CWA)</u> [33 U.S.C. §1251 et seq. (1972)]. Examples of DMAs are cities, towns, public works authorities, or the name of the entity or entities owning the wastewater treatment facility (WWTF). DMAs can also operate WWTFs at private facilities such as mobile home parks, tribal casinos, and private camping areas. Water treatment plants must complete DMA forms for treatment of their decant and backwash wastewater if they have not previously submitted a DMA for their specified area.

DMAs must have the legal authority to:

- Incur short-term indebtedness, incur long-term indebtedness, accept grants, or raise revenues for the purpose of wastewater treatment.
- Manage wastewater treatment facilities in a designated area. Managing WWTFs includes either directly or by contract – their design, construction, operation, and maintenance.

Select the appropriate form attached to these instructions. If there is one owner or DMA, complete the Statement of Acceptance as the Designated Management Agency (208 DMA Form – Single). If there are two entities serving as the DMA for a facility (such as a city and municipal works authority), each entity must complete and sign Statement Accepting Joint Designated Management Agency Status (208 DMA Form – Joint). Water treatment facilities treating backwash water and are not covered by a previous DMA must complete the Statement of Acceptance as the Designated Management Agency for Water Treatment Plants Only (208 DMA Form – Water Treatment Plant). One example of water treatment plants covered by a previous DMA is the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust. The Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust is the DMA for the Oklahoma City service area. In this example, all wastewater treatment facilities and any water treatment plants that treat backwash water in the Oklahoma City service area are covered by the Oklahoma City Water Utilities Trust DMA.

Complete the sections of the applicable DMA form according the the following instructions:

Section A:

Insert the name or names of the DMA, the name of the facility, the area served by the DMA, and the facility's OPDES permit number (Oklahoma Pollutant Discharge Elimination System; sometimes referred to as "NPDES" for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) if the facility has a discharge permit. These numbers begin with "OK00...". Also please include the facility's ID number, if you have one. These may begin with "S-...." or "W-....".

"By signing below, Name of the entity owning the WWTF agrees to accept the designation as the Designated Management Agency (DMA) for the Facility Name in the area served by the facility service area."

Example: "By signing below, the Northtown Municipal Authority [or for a joint DMA] and the Town of

Northtown agree to accept the designation as the Designated Management Agency (DMA) for the

Northtown Wastewater Treatment Facility in the Town of Northtown service area."

Section B: If the DMA has a different address than the facility, enter the address in Section B.

Section C: This section lists the responsibilities the DMA agrees to accept.

Section D: To be signed by authorized individual(s). Examples include the mayor of a town or the chairperson

of a public works authority. For a joint DMA, if the mayor and chairperson are the same person, the

form must be signed by the same person at the two designated places using each title.

Section E: Send the signed DMA to the person/address listed on the form.

New DMA forms must be completed when there is a change in the name of the DMA.
