SUMMARY:

The Department of Environmental Quality (Department or DEQ) is proposing to amend Oklahoma Administrative Code (OAC) 252:110, Lead-Based Paint Management, to update the incorporation by reference section, to include provisions to implement the military reciprocity bill (59 O.S. § 4100, et seq., Military Service Occupation, Education, and Credentialing Act), to update clearance levels to parallel dust-lead hazard changes, and to correct minor punctuation and grammar errors. The proposed updates to clearance levels are necessary to maintain EPA approval for Oklahoma's Lead-Based Paint program. The gist of the proposed rulemaking is to update the rule in accordance with recent changes to the federal lead-based paint poisoning prevention requirements, and to provide reciprocity for active duty military service members and their spouses.

COMMENT PERIOD:

Written comments may be submitted to the contact person from May 15, 2020, through June 15, 2020. Oral comments may be made at the June 17, 2020 hearing and at the September 15, 2020 Environmental Quality Board hearing in Altus, Oklahoma.

PUBLIC HEARING:

Before the Air Quality Advisory Council at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, June 17, 2020, via videoconference or teleconference in compliance with the Open Meetings Act, as amended by SB 661 (2020). Members of the Council and public may attend via videoconference or teleconference, and a room will be available at the DEQ Headquarters, 707 N. Robinson Ave., Oklahoma City, OK 73102, for any members of the public who wish to attend in person. Videoconference or

In the event the current state of emergency has expired or been terminated by the Governor, the hearing shall take place at the same date and time at the DEQ Headquarters, 707 N. Robinson Avenue, Oklahoma City, OK 73102. If the Council recommends adoption, the proposed rules will be considered by the Environmental Quality Board at its meeting scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 15, 2020, in Altus, Oklahoma.

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS FROM BUSINESS ENTITIES:

The Department requests that business entities or any other members of the public affected by these rules provide the Department, within the comment period, in dollar amounts if possible, the increase in the level of direct costs such as fees, and the indirect costs such as reporting, record keeping, equipment, construction, labor, professional services, revenue loss, or other costs expected to be incurred by a particular entity due to compliance with the proposed rules.
