SUMMARY:

The Department of Environmental Quality (Department or DEQ) is proposing to amend the air quality portions of Chapter 4, Subchapter 7 to better align the Department's issuance process and public participation procedures for Part 70 source construction and operating permits with the New Source Review (NSR) permit requirements and Title V operating permit requirements promulgated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in 40 CFR Part 51, Subpart I, and 40 CFR Part 70, respectively. The proposal would also provide for the Department's use of online notice for Tier I applications for certain permits. Specifically, amendments are being proposed to subsection (g), (Additional notice content requirements for Clean Air Act Permits) of OAC 252:4-7-13, Notices; OAC 252:4-7-32, Air quality applications – Tier I; and OAC 252:4-7-33, Air quality applications – Tier II. The gist of the proposed rule and the underlying reason for these revisions is to ensure that the State's rules are not less stringent than the federal rules require. This will remove an obstacle in obtaining approval from EPA for relevant portions of Oklahoma's State Implementation Plan (SIP), which will help ensure that the Department retains approval of the state NSR permit program and the Title V operating permit program.

COMMENT PERIOD:

Written comments may be submitted to the contact person from April 1, 2020, through May 4, 2020. Oral comments may be made at the May 13, 2020 hearing and at the June 9, 2020 Environmental Quality Board hearing in Oklahoma City.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Before the Air Quality Advisory Council at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, May 13, 2020, at TulsaTech, 10800 North 140th East Avenue, Owasso, OK 74055. If the Council recommends adoption, the proposed rules will be considered by the Environmental Quality Board at its meeting scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 9, 2020, at the DEQ Headquarters, 707 N. Robinson Avenue, Oklahoma City, OK 73102.

These hearings shall also serve as public hearings to receive comments on the proposed revisions to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) under the requirements of 40 CFR Section 51.102 and 27A O.S. Section 2-5-107(6)(c), and to the State Title V (Part 70) Implementation Plan under the requirements of 40 CFR Part 70 and 27A O.S. Section 2-5-112(B)(9).

REQUEST FOR COMMENTS FROM BUSINESS ENTITIES:

The Department requests that business entities or any other members of the public affected by these rules provide the Department, within the comment period, in dollar amounts if possible, the increase in the level of direct costs such as fees, and the indirect costs such as reporting,

recordkeeping, equipment, construction, labor, professional services, revenue loss, or other costs expected to be incurred by a particular entity due to compliance with the proposed rules.
