MR. EDWARDS: Thank you once again. Before I hand it off to Ryan to do the actual incorporation by reference discussion, I'll just mention that our rules were published by OAR as predicted September 15th, and so basically that means that the rulemaking we did last year is effective, and we will be able to use that in our next authorization submittal, which I'm hoping to put together in the very near future.

You may recall the rulemaking that we did last year included many corrections to the state rules that EPA had identified, and so it's kind of odd to be excited by such things, but I'm kind of excited with the updates to the rules. I think it cleans things up and it makes us -- well, it makes us updated as far as our authorization, so kudos on that.

Having said that, I will hand off to Ryan to discuss the incorporation by

Page 12

reference.

MR. KIRK: Thanks, Mike. Again, this is Ryan Kirk. The rules we're presenting to the Council today will allow waste aerosol cans to be managed as universal waste if the generator chooses this option. This is a choice that they can make. It's, obviously, voluntary. It's not mandatory.

This rule was published as a final rule on December 9th, 2019, and became effective at the federal level on February 7th, 2020.

For context I'm going to give just a brief review of the Universal Waste Program. Universal waste is a subset of Hazardous Waste that can be managed under 40 CFR Part 273, and those requirements rather than RCRA subtitle C regulations.

These specific wastes are very common in terms of the sheer number of facilities in which they're found, as well as their presence across a wide range of industrial sectors. This is why the term universal is used in the name.

They're also found in a lot of

businesses that don't otherwise generate

1 hazardous waste. EPA's two main goals, when

they established this program, were to 3

4 increase recycling of these materials and

5 reduce illegal disposal of these materials by

providing management options that are both 6 7

simpler and more cost-effective for the

generator to implement.

Universal waste at the federal level, you want to keep in mind, that aerosol cans as of February, are universal waste at the federal level as well. So previously the universal waste at the federal level were hazardous waste lamps, most commonly fluorescent bulbs, fluorescent lamps, batteries, pesticides, and Mercury-containing equipment.

Why did EPA consider adding aerosol cans to the universal waste program? Aerosol cans are very likely going to be hazardous waste. The propellant is ignitable, quite possibly the contents of the can is ignitable, the contents can be toxic. The can itself is pressurized, so it can be -- it's going to be a reactive hazardous waste, most likely.

Page 1.

It satisfies the universal aspect, I spoke of a minute ago, very common across a wide range of industrial sectors.

EPA has determined that the aerosol cans meet the evaluation factors for inclusion in the universal waste program. There's 7, 8 factors for inclusion of this program. Some of them, I'm not going to specifically point them out, but some of them correspond to some of the things I've mentioned, or will mention.

One, in particular, is they have successfully managed universal waste at the state level in five states. And, in some cases, for many years. Waste management officials from these states concur that their objectives have been met. The objectives of the program have been met, and they have not had any problems.

So how would this rule be different than the -- than regulation in full RCRA subtitle C regulation? Aerosol cans under this rule would be subject to less stringent -- I'll just give a few examples here. I'm not going to go through everything. But less stringent labelings, storage time

ending up in municipal landfill where we don't want them to go. And not to mention, there's

the proper management of the cans at the

facility which is basically non-existent.

I believe this is partly due to the fact that a lot of hazardous waste, when used in a commercial setting, are similar, if not identical physically and chemically, to chemicals that we have in our homes under your sink, in your garage. But the fact that in a commercial setting, these materials are often purchased in large quantities and used with industrial equipment.

So basically if you store something in a 55-gallon drum versus a 2-quart container in your garage, it just seems different. It's really not. An aerosol can is an aerosol can. So sometimes people have trouble getting their head around the fact that you're allowed to throw something away at home, but the exact same thing has a long list of requirements that it's used for at work that you have to adhere to.

We believe that adopting this rule will result in fewer cans ending up in

Page 15 limits, manifest rules, they're a little more relaxed than full regulations.

And, at the same time, they ensure that -- and I'll just give a few examples here. Employees still receive training, containers have to be structurally sound, they have to be closed. Other considerations such as -- that are unique to aerosol cans in this context. One example is they have to be a safe distance from heat sources, such as open flames and sparks, so there's definitely a protective component there as well that is required.

I'd like to briefly share my experience while visiting businesses for the last 20 years as a hazardous waste -- with the hazardous waste compliance section at ODEQ.

Basically it's extremely common to observe aerosol cans when you're walking through facilities. It's very common to observe aerosol cans in a trash container. When you ask the facility people about it they, oftentimes, they're surprised that the cans are going to be a hazardous waste. And so this results in a large amount of cans

municipal landfills, is one advantage.

In conclusion, because this rule is less stringent than full regulation, states are not required to adopt it. However, we believe that adopting this rule will result in more aerosol cans being sent for recycling, or to a proper disposal facility, while maintaining adequate safeguards to protect human health and the environment, and potentially for providing monetary savings to the generators through reduced hazardous waste management costs. And I can provide the regulatory impact analysis prepared by the EPA if anybody requests a copy.

So does anybody have any questions or comments?

MR. EDWARDS: I'm just going to make one additional comment, which is that we did receive a comment, an official comment from the public, essentially, and that was the Household and Commercial Products Association, HCPA, and the comment was in favor of the incorporation by reference.
