19-20 Scor3card Cohort Impact

Sustainable Tulsa 2020 Scor3card verified members reported on their Sustainability initiatives and KPIs for 2019 activity. Each member has the total 50 directives/action items and 70 KPIs that they can report on and manage individually. Sustainable Tulsa collates the data to share overall performance in our state. The 2020 the 37 Verified Members completed 1,345 directives toward their sustainability initiatives and 1,316 key performance indicators.

Highlights of the KPIs for the 2019-20 Scor3card Cycle

- Scor3card members reported the donation of 11,456 volunteer hours to various Oklahoma nonprofits.*
- Through **demand-side energy efficiency programs** recommended by Scor3card, members reported annual savings in 2019 of \$2,172,445.50! This brings our total Scor3card savings to over \$7,000,000.*
- By purchasing **carbon offsets** in 2019-20, Scor3card members offset 10,089,602 metric tons of CO₂.* Which is equivalent to:
 - 2,178 wind turbines running for a year.
 - 3,431,838 tons of waste recycled instead of landfilled.
 - 1,164,274 homes' energy use for one year.
- 62,937 tons recycled.*
- \$15,065,062.68 donated to Oklahoma nonprofits.*
- 92,296 pounds of composting collected.*
